FINAL JUDGMENT

This case is before the court after the bench trial commenced on March 21, 2011, and completed on April 19, 2011. The court heard live testimony from thirtysix witnesses, designated deposition testimony from eight additional witnesses, admitted more than seven hundred exhibits, and received post-trial briefs from the parties in excess of one thousand pages. After considering all the evidence and the arguments of counsel, the court concludes that plaintiffs have failed to meet their burden of demonstrating, by a preponderance of the evidence, that defendants have
